# The Store at Five Corners to Open in April

The historic Store at Five Corners is set to open soon under new management.

Plans are to be open daily from 7am until 7pm, including holidays (except for Thanksgiving and Christmas). There will be breakfast and lunch items and on-line ordering so that customers will be able to pick up prepared dinner items on their way home without a wait.

“We’re shooting for no later than April 15,” said new operator Colleen Taylor of Bay State Hospitality Group, LLC. She and her brother Sean are well established in the food business, having owned the Freight Yard Pub in North Adams since 1992, and more recently the Trail House Kitchen and Bar as well as the Craft Food Barn and Berkshire Catering Company.

This means they have systems and staff in place and will be ready to hit the ground running. Coming from a family of six children, Colleen is pleased to announce that her sister and brother Maureen and Philip Taylor will be helping out at the Store as well.

“We’re really looking forward to being part of the South Williamstown community. My kids went to Mount Greylock Regional School so I am acquainted with some neighbors already. We’re planning to stock basic groceries as well as special gift items and we’ve moved the big table to the center of the Store to be a welcoming place to gather when people drop in to have a cup of coffee or buy a quart of milk.”

Karen Charbonneau, president of The Store at Five Corners Stewardship Association, the non-profit organization that owns the Store, was delighted to learn that the Taylors own a mobile wood-fired pizza oven that can be employed.

When asked how she got into the food business, Colleen answered: “It started when I was 14 or 15. My brother Sean is about five years older than I am and he was working a large party at a country club in Southington, Connecticut. There were going to be about 2,000 people there and they needed extra help. He asked if I wanted to make some extra money. I said ‘Sure,’ and there I was getting my feet wet by filling water glasses. When I was in college I had an internship at Sheraton Hotel and Towers and went on from there.”

The Store at Five Corners has been an important community hub since the 1700s and welcomes its new operators.

## Future Plans for Former Hart Landfill

The following is an excerpt from a longer article by Stephen Dravis published by iBerkshires on January 20, 2026, reprinted here with permission:

[...The Williamstown] Planning Board [has] approved a request from the town to subdivide a South Williamstown property owned by the Hart family.

A portion of the 8.25-acre parcel on New Ashford Road (Route 7) was used as a town landfill in the 20th century, and the town is seeking to acquire part of the lot in order to maintain the degraded portion.

"It's our responsibility to stabilize and maintain [the landfill site] long term," Community Development Director Andrew Groff told the board. "So we are transferring property from the Hart family. They're going to maintain the home that's on New Ashford Road. The town is going to maintain the landfill on the back lot. So it is a building lot, but nothing will ever be built there."

Public Works Director Craig Clough told the board about how the town plans to maintain the former landfill in order to protect the Green River, which runs behind the property.

"Because this landfill is up against a river bank, we do have to stabilize the bank, because we do have some of the old trash that gets into the river," Clough said. "What it's going to be in the future is a lot of bioengineering, probably a lot of tree cribbing and stuff like that to actually build up the bank that is on the west side of the river. We'll stabilize all that so we no longer have the intrusion of rubbish into the river."

The Planning Board's 5-0 approval of the subdivision is one step in the town's process to acquire a portion of the property. Ultimately, the acquisition will require the approval of town meeting.

*Added Note by SWCA: The Hart Landfill, which closed in 1960, is the source of debris that has been collected for the past several summers in the Green River Cleanup organized by SWCA and HooRWA.*

## Green River Farm to Become Distribution Center for Farmers to You.

Green River Regenerative Farm, launched at the intersection of Green River Road and Route 7 in

2024, is taking on a new profile, and the animals are coming back this spring.

According to consultant Adam Grady, a 10th generation farmer from Keenanville, North Carolina, who's been coming to Williamstown regularly to give advice since 2024, there will be chickens, eggs, pigs and possibly grass-fed beef. The primary focus will be meat this year.

Jan-Gisbert Schultze and Paul-Bernard Kallen, owners based in Germany, have been investors for several years in an on-line grocery platform Farmers to You. It has been based in Vermont, but headquarters for the direct-to-consumer distribution business is moving to Green River Regenerative Farm in Williamstown. Corey Wentworth, former operator of The Store at Five Corners right next door, is now the operations manager for Green River Farm. His background as a chef featuring farm-to-table food makes him an ideal person to help build a local anchor for Farmers to You.

Farmers to You connects local producers to consumers through home deliveries and pickup locations. Green River Farm will be a pickup location for our local community and area farmers will have a new market.

The regenerative farming philosophy remains the same. Adam Grady has been employing it successfully on his farm for several years. Grady says "It's all about keeping roots in the soil, growing a diverse range of crops and bringing a wide range of grazing animals back to the land."

When asked about the apple trees planted along Route 7, Grady said that they have mostly reverted to root stock and won't be useful in producing a cash crop, but that pigs will be grazing under the trees and enjoying their bounty. The cider making equipment at the farm has been passed on to a local producer who suffered a loss from a fire.

Mickey is survived by her sons Matthew and Gabriel and their families, her twin sister Theresa Wegman who cared for her devotedly during her illness, her sister Marietta, and her good friend and Sloan Tavern Mustard collaborator Carolyn Umlauf as well as a host of community friends.
